Parliamentary Tip

"So, why do we have to follow all these rules of parliamentary procedure?

They seem so nit-picky and overly formal."

Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, 12th Edition justifies the use of parliamentary procedure this way:

"Parliamentary procedure enables the overall membership of an organization – expressing its general will through the assembly of its members – both to establish and empower an effective leadership as it wishes, and at the same time to retain exactly the degree of direct control over its affairs that it chooses to reserve to itself."

Ok, that's a mouthful!

Perhaps more simply stated, parliamentary procedure and rules, though detailed and sometimes tedious, ensure the right of both the majority and minority members of an organization to be heard, and allow an organization to conduct business in an efficient, reliable and stable manner.

Protocol Pearls

October: The attire for Chapter Meetings: Appropriate attire should always reflect the Links tradition and high standards. The monthly Chapter Meetings is business attire as reflected in the Protocol Manual. Please dress accordingly, unless authorized by the Chapter President for special circumstances.

November: At a Chapter event when the National President and Area Director are attending, such as fundraisers and anniversaries, the Area Director of her Area is introduced just prior to the National President. All attendees stand when the Area Director is introduced and are asked to remain standing for the introduction of the National President

January: Who Speaks for the Chapter: The Chapter President speaks for the Chapter – only on Chapter issues. The Chapter President may designate individuals to represent her for specific events or to represent the Chapter at the Chapter level before other organizations or the media.

February: The National Pledge and Song of The Links, Incorporated should begin all closed (Links only) meetings, such as National and Area plenary sessions and Chapter meetings. The Links Pledge and Song are not used in public or social events (e.g. Civic Luncheons, Award Luncheons, White Rose Banquet, Chapter fundraisers, etc.) where non-Links are present. Meditations or "Linkspirations" have been customarily used in The Links, Incorporated public or social events.

March: The official pin is always worn on the left side near your heart. The Official Pin should never be worn with casual clothing or at casual events (jeans, shorts, capris, sweatpants, sundresses, t-shirts, tennis shoes, etc.).

April: The current President is addressed, introduced, etc. as the National President and not by the number (17th National President) until she leaves office. The numerical designation for the National President is used when she leaves the office.

Services to Youth

Services to Youth was excited to welcome the students from STEAM Academy to its first face-to-face event for the year on April 23. We had 17 students and 3 chaperones. The students enjoyed an informative discussion with the playwright where they asked questions and explored the Freedom Riders and their historic significance. The talk was followed by a picnic lunch and the production, Freedom Riders.

Additionally, Services to Youth worked with the ARTs Facet on the Poster Competition and the Linking Legos to Arts. Students from multiple high schools in the River Region participated in both competitions.
