S.T.E.A.M Academy

S.T.E.A.M. Academy is an ongoing program which builds on community partnerships to encourage youth to get excited about careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math. Our latest adventure was a 5week summer initiative. We introduced participants to the concept Metamorphosis. We educated them on the Juneteenth holiday through a celebration and hands on soap making contest which were later used as gifts for the people in their lives upon whose shoulders they stand. Judge Lloria James and Chief Deputy District Attorney Azzie Taylor discussed how science and technology are used in the criminal justice system and how accomplice liability should encourage them to choose their friends wisely. Roosevelt Robinson helped them understand the significance of recycling and helped them learn to plant fruits and vegetables. Our medical career day was a huge hit, lead by Dr. Porcia Love (Dermatologist), Dr. Kendra Gillis-Colvin (Pediatrician) and Dr. Dana Willis-Henderson (Veterinarian), who introduced participants to their careers and educated them on why they should consider careers in medicine. Participants learned about how the digestive system works as they colored aprons illustrating their organs with Samarria Dunson. Finally, they participated in a fun and exciting Robotics and Coding Workshop and Competition led by Jhavon Brown from Bear Exploration Center and organized by Janel Bell-Haynes. Alumna members, Connecting Links, and Heir O'Links all played a part to ensure that this kick-off to the program year was successful. Feedback was that this S.T.E.A.M. Academy was an overwhelming success and we look forward to continuing the relationship throughout the program year.



















Praise Breaks - September

Link Bernice, inducted in 1987, devoted thirty-one years of faithful service to the Montgomery (AL) Chapter before transferring to Alumnae Status. During those years, Link Bernice served in a number of leadership roles in the chapter as well as the community. In the chapter, Link Bernice served as Chaplain, Recording secretary, Protocols and Rituals Chair, as well as Chair of the Services to Youth and The Arts Facets. Under her leadership, the chapter received awards and recognition at both the Southern Area and National levels. The Services to Youth Facet received recognition at the Southern Area level as a best practice for the three-year program: "Fit for Fun - Girls taking Charge of Their WellBeing," This was part of the Southern Area's focus on obesity. The Arts Facet received the Poster Arts Award as well as third place for a book of original meditations presented to the residents of St Jude. Link Bernice also served as a member of the National Evaluation team for Programs and as a member of the National Protocol Committee at two National Assemblies.



In the community, Link Bernice has served on Executive Committees of the Montgomery Symphony Orchestra and the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts. Additionally, she served two terms on the Board of Directors of Leadership Montgomery. Moreover, Link Bernice was the first African American to chair the Alabama State Council on the Arts and the first African American from Alabama to sit on the Board of Directors of The National Association of State Art Agencies, located in Washington, D.C. She was one of five women recipients of the Martin Luther King, Jr. "Drum Major for Justice" Award. In September, 2021, Link Bernice reunited with the Chapter as an active member. She is married to Connecting Link, Judge Charles Price and is the mother of Link Susan Yvette Price and Heir- o -Link Judge Charles Price, II. She is a retired Assistant Professor of Humanities at Alabama State University.

Therefore, the Southern Area of the Links, Day of Service was embraced and completed successfully June 5, 2021, by the Montgomery Chapter of the Links, collecting professional dress clothing such as suits, and other items for students attending Alabama State University, the largest HBCU in Montgomery.
